#### MAT/LA level information Guidance

As at January 2020:

- this school is maintained by Cornwall local authority which maintains 55 primary schools, 5 secondary schools, no special schools, no pupil referral units and 2 nursery schools.

#### School workforce Guidance

According to the November 2018 school workforce census:

- in 2017/18, 75% of teachers had at least one period of sickness absence compared with a national average of 54%.
- in 2017/18, 2.7 days on average were lost to teacher sickness absence compared with a national average of 4.0.
- at the time of the census, there were no full-time vacant teacher posts in the school.

#### **Ethnicity** Guidance

#### Local area Guidance

- The school location deprivation indicator was in quintile 3 (average) of all schools.
- The pupil base is in quintile 3 (average deprivation) of all schools in terms of deprivation.

#### Finance Guidance

- In 2018/19, the school had a revenue reserve of £33.885.
- In 2018/19, this school had a negative in-year balance (£-11,455), the second year in a row in which expenditure has exceeded income.
- In 2018/19, this school had a per pupil spend of £6,455, a decrease of £573 per pupil from the previous year.
- In 2018/19, this school received £422,431 in grant funding, £871,020 less than the national average.
